Our Yield Experience.* AgriSecure has minimal yield experience. However, FBN had over 1,000 growers working with FBN in 2019 and will be sharing yield data as it becomes available.

Conclusion. FBN's seed portfolio is growing rapidly, and aggressive pricing and financing options make them worth consideration.

Our Yield Experience.* AgriSecure is engaged with a group of lowa growers with 20+ years of experience and 8,000+ acres of corn and soybeans who use Prairie Hybrids on most of their acreage. At this time, our network does not have sufficient experience to formulate a strong position on yield potential. We expect it may approach conventional yields based on the right environmental conditions and production practices.

Conclusion. Prairie Hybrids has a strong reputation and is worth consideration.

<u>Seitec Genetics.</u> Seitec is currently focusing on 114-day hybrids, which are likely worth small-scale trials.

Our Yield Experience.* Our network has extensive experience with Seitec's non-GMO hybrids (very strong performance). We've grown 2,700+ acres of organic corn with Seitec seed for above average yields versus production history. In 2018, Rhea Bros. grew organic seed corn for Seitec but we've not yet grown their organic hybrids.

Conclusion. Seitec offers strong yielding varieties and outstanding customer service with competitive pricing. There's potential upside with their seed and, under the right conditions and management practices, it could achieve or exceed standard yield history.
